Mt. Rainier Dr. named for mountain; named by Capt. Vancouver to honor Adm. Peter Rainier. (Peak - El. 14,408)

named for adjacent street

Cascadia Av. honors the Cascade Mts., named by David Douglas for cascading river (Columbia)

**RIDGEWAY PL.**  
11,800 sq. ft.  
named for adjacent street  
Re-named 1927 "Christmas Park" by local petition

**Ferris Pl.**  
named for Chauncey W. Ferris member of the Hunter Tract Impr. Co., acq. Dan Jones & Co.

**Hanford St.**

named for Edw. Hanford, pioneer, brother-in-law of John Holgate.



**BOULEVARD 1.46 Ac.**

**Horton St.**

named for Dexter Horton, pioneer, whose coffee barrel was Seattle's first bank.

Parkway named for the land development ex.: Hunter Tract Improvement Co. Ded. in orig. plat

**Hinds St.**

**Spokane St.**

named for city in Eastern Washington - from Indian tribe - "children of the sun"

named for adjacent street to honor mountain range - Sierra Nevadas. (From Latin word - saw)
