 Headwaters of Longfellow Creek gathered in tile and drains northward under Barton St.; flows on thru West Seattle Golf to Elliott Bay.

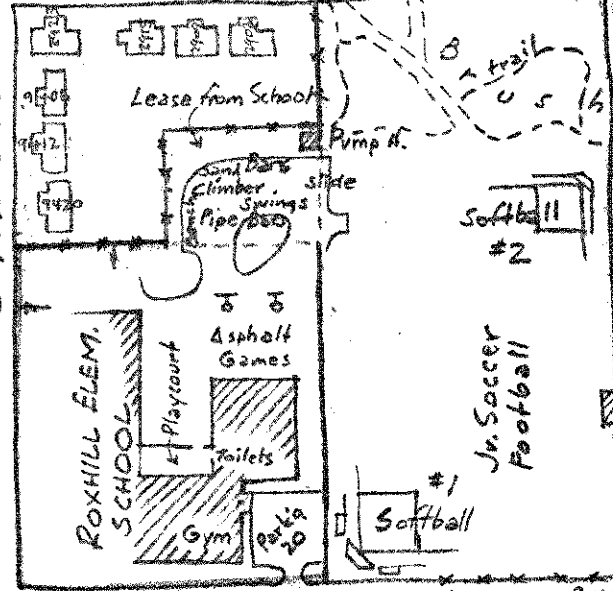
