MISSION

The Seattle Public Library Foundation helps the Library build its collection and resources, offer programs for patrons of all ages, and better serve the needs of our community. We do this by securing and managing donations from individuals, businesses and foundations to support the Library above and beyond what public funding provides.

The Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation 501(c)(3) established in 1980 and governed by a volunteer board of directors. A professional staff raises and administers gifts and ensures the effectiveness of funded programs.

Since its founding, The Seattle Public Library Foundation has raised more than \$100 million for the Library to support:

- Building new and revitalized libraries in every neighborhood.
- Programming for children, teens, and adults.
- Books and resources, including funding for special collections.
- Services for those with special needs, such as the disabled, immigrants, and refugees.
- Technology resources for library patrons.

HOW WE ARE DIFFERENT FROM THE FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY

Often the Foundation and Friends of the Library are referred to interchangeably. While we work closely, we are two separate non-profit organizations who support The Seattle Public Library in different ways.

The Friends of The Seattle Public Library is a grassroots membership organization dedicated to promoting our Library through well organized

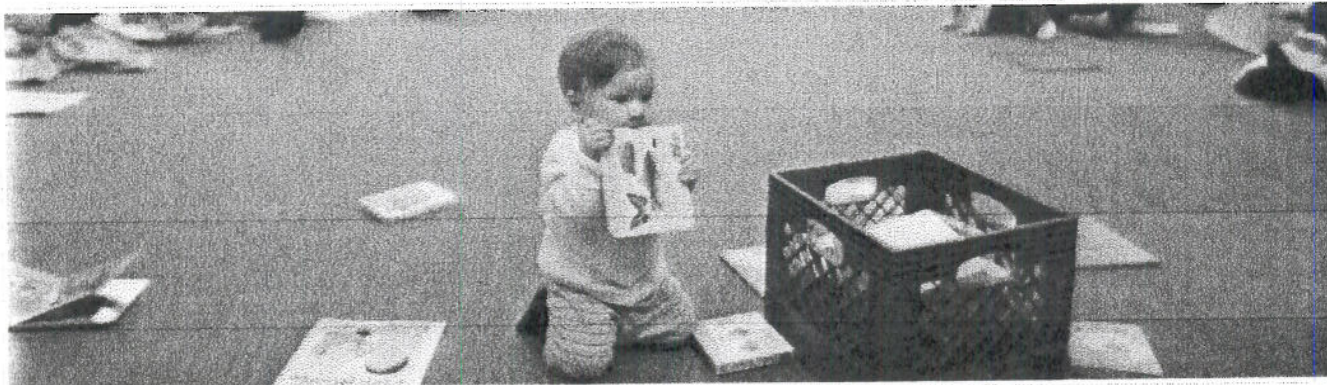

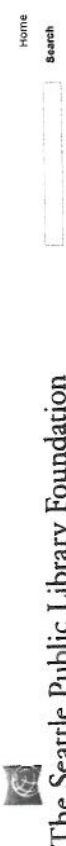

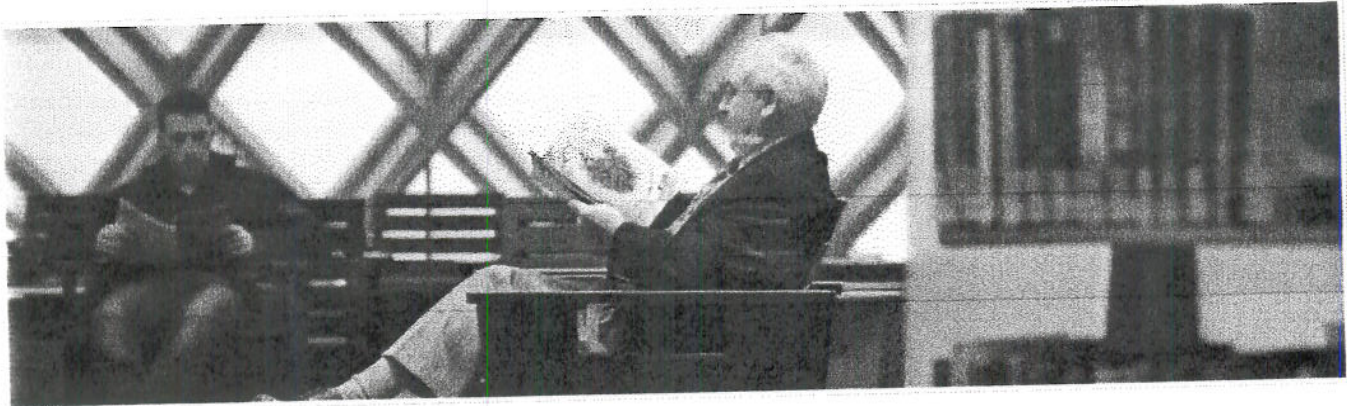

YES FOR SEATTLE LIBRARIES

Seattle's public libraries are treasured resources and neighborhood gathering places - enriching lives every day. Libraries provide access to lifelong learning and economic, social and cultural benefits for all. They are where students get homework help, unemployed residents come for job resources and those without access to technology learn how to use computers. But four years of constraints on Seattle's general fund have led to unacceptable cuts to hours, educational programs, books and other media and computer technology. And in 2013, the Library faces additional cuts that will result in a loss of services equal to closing five branches. Voters will have the opportunity to change this trend by voting to pass Seattle Proposition 1 this August.
